Yellow Perch Trail

Length of Ride

4.0 miles, all roads are paved

Terrain

One gentle slope that you will travel both ways on, otherwise it is all flat and paved.

What You Can Expect to See

This ride will take you to the Mississippi River, and to the Trempealeau Lakes on a very relaxing and shady route. You will pass by a Coffee, Sandwich and Ice Cream Shop, and full service mini mart gas station, and then you will descend towards the Mighty Mississippi River and the Trempealeau Lakes. As you pedal along Lake Road, you will have very nice river views. Relax at a riverside table and enjoy the views, dip your toes in the Mississippi if you'd like at a rustic riverside eatery along Lake Road. Be on the lookout for Eagles, Deer, Turtles and other wildlife on this route. Continuing on, you will pedal through the Lakes area under the trees which form a very nice dappled shade canopy over the road for much of the ride. Enjoy the shorelines of Round lake, Long Lake, Second and Third Lakes. There are park benches to rest on, and piers to fish from. You will again enjoy the views on Lake Road on your return trip to the Trailhead.

This trail begins and ends at your choice of the Great River Trailhead parking lot, or the Swimming pool parking lot. Riding the Great River Trail outside of the Trempealeau Village Limits will require a Trail Pass, which is available in town.

Bike Trails



Length of Ride

11.2 miles, all roads are paved

Terrain

Very flat riding, no inclines or slopes of note

What You Can Expect to See

This ride will take you out on the Sand Prairie formed by the same Ice Age melting that created the Mississippi River and the Bluffs. You will pedal by the Public Golf Course, and then by vast farm fields and prairie woods. If you are lucky you may see a Bob White quail or other prairie dwellers on your ride. Bring your swimsuits, and on your way back into town you may want to cool off with a swim at the Municipal Pool, before you return to the Trailhead. This trail begins and ends at your choice of the Great River Trailhead parking lot, or the Swimming pool parking lot. Riding the Great River Trail outside of the Trempealeau Village Limits will require a Trail Pass, which is available in town.



Length of Ride

8.2 miles, all roads are paved

Terrain

A gentle slope downward, and one gentle upslope, otherwise flat riding on paved roads

What You Can Expect to See

In Trempealeau you will pass by a Coffee, Sandwich and Ice Cream Shop, a full service mini mart gas station, Duck Pond Park, and by Historic Main Street, including the Trempealeau Hotel. From there you will pedal along Sullivan Road with magnificent Mississippi River views the entire length, and pass by the famous Sullivan's Restaurant. You will then enter Perrot Park and pedal thru the park with its beautiful scenery, Mississippi River views, and opportunities for rest stops with great vistas. Chances are good that you may see an Eagle along the river, and Deer and other wildlife in Perrot Park. Moving on you will reconnect with the Great River Bike Trail and will pass thru the center of Trempealeau, with great views of our peaceful village as you return to the Trailhead.

This trail begins and ends at your choice of the Great River Trailhead parking lot, or the Swimming pool parking lot. Riding the Great River Trail outside of the Trempealeau Village Limits will require a Trail Pass, which is available in town.

Green Turtl Trail





Length of Ride

2.3 miles, all roads are paved.

Terrain

Several gradual inclines and downslopes in Perrot Park, one gradual downslope in Trempealeau

What You Can Expect to See

This ride will take you to the Mississippi River and to the Historic downtown. Along the way you will pass by a Coffee, Sandwich and Ice Cream Shop, and by a full service mini mart gas station, and then you will descend towards the Mighty Mississipi River. You will pedal to Lock and Dam number 6 which control's the Rivers depth and allows commercial and recreational boats to pass through. You can enter the observation deck and watch river traffic, and see the lock operations. You will see the Trempealeau Fishing Float on the River, and their launch point is only a short distance should you feel the urge to fish! From here you will pass by the Marina and its "Tiki" Bar should you need refreshments along with a great view of the Marina and Trempealeau Mountain. Continuing on you will pass by Duck Pond Park, and Sportsmens Park, where you may find a park bench or picnic table to take a break. You will pedal thru Historic Main Street, and pass by the Historic Trempealeau Hotel. As you pedal towards your return, you will pass by Central Park, and its new playground. Enjoy the many shade trees and cool park benches. Bring your swimsuit, and stop at the Municipal Pool for a swim, before returning to the Trailhead.

This trail begins and ends at your choice of the Great River Trailhead parking lot, or the Swimming pool parking lot. Riding the Great River Trail outside of the Trempealeau Village Limits will require a Trail Pass, which is available in town.
